Empowering Pharmacists in the Fight Against Substance Abuse

In an insightful discussion, we engaged with Dr. Nicole Gastala, MD and Dr. Brianna McQuade, PharmD, BCACP, MHPE, about the pivotal role pharmacists play in combatting substance use disorder. Dr. Gastala is the Medical Director of Substance Use Prevention and Recovery Division at the Illinois Department of Human Services, and Dr. McQuade is a Clinical Pharmacist at UIC Family Medicine.

"Pharmacists have the power to make a significant impact in the fight against substance abuse," emphasizes Dr. Gastala. "Their role is crucial in ensuring that naloxone remains accessible to all high-risk patients." Dr. McQuade adds, "Understanding buprenorphine's pharmacology is crucial for its safe and effective use. Pharmacists can make a real difference by conducting thorough patient interviews, reviewing data, and navigating insurance challenges."
