Buprenorphine and the pathway to a renewed life

"Preventing Opioid Misuse and Abuse" is one of the most popular and important educational topics offered by IL ADVANCE. Key messages relevant to prescriber practice include screening, tapering, and treatment of opioid use disorder (OUD). Discussion about screening is important for providers as 2019 data showed only 1 in 5 patients with OUD received treatment. Some subgroups in the study had even lower rates. Easy-to-use tapering resources that include when to consider a taper and examples of varying rates of taper can be valuable tools for providers. We received consistent feedback that providers wanted more detailed information on buprenorphine treatment, especially initiating treatment of OUD. In response we have developed supplemental material, "Buprenorphine: Increasing Access to Recovery".
