CMS EXPANDS MEDICARE COVERAGE FOR HIV PREP STARTING SEPTEMBER 30, 2024

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will begin covering HIV Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) as a preventive service under Medicare starting September 30, 2024. This coverage will apply to beneficiaries with Medicare Part A or Part B.

The expanded coverage includes antiretroviral medications for PrEP, along with up to eight counseling sessions per year focused on HIV risk assessment, risk reduction, and medication adherence. Additionally, beneficiaries can receive up to eight HIV screenings annually, as well as a one-time hepatitis B screening. Providers should use ICD-10 codes Z29.81 for PrEP visits and Z11.4 for HIV screenings when billing.
