On March 28, 2025, the FDA granted marketing authorization for the first at-home test to diagnose chlamydia, gonorrhea, and trichomoniasis in females. This test boasts an accuracy rate of over 97% in correctly identifying positive or negative cases. The ability to self-test in the comfort of one's home underscores the FDA's commitment to recognizing the importance of sexual health.
